Ann Wright called the meeting to order at 6:30 PM.

By motion of Jim Kach, seconded by Krista Butts, the school board voted to move into non-public session under RSA 91-A:3 II (b). This motion passed by unanimous vote.

By motion of Ann Wright, seconded by Jim Kach, the school board voted to accept a letter of resignation submitted by a teacher. This motion passed by unanimous vote.

By motion of Ann Wright, seconded by Jocelyn O'Quinn, the school board voted to accept, with appreciation, letters of retirement submitted by two members of the faculty. This motion passed by unanimous vote.

By motion of Ann Wright, seconded by Ann Lane, the school board voted to approve a maternity leave for a member of the faculty. This motion passed by unanimous vote.

By motion of Ann Wright, seconded by Krista Butts, the school board voted to approve offering employment contracts for 2011-2012 to a slate of teachers and other professional staff as submitted by the superintendent. This motion passed by unanimous vote.

The school board reviewed salary comparisons for high school principals.
